Eight educational/public webinars: Goats to control invasive plants; the health of White's Woods, stormwater runoff; bird habitat; climate change; i-Tree analysis; Hartley Wood management plan; ecology of invasive plants. Hired Consultants to Evaluate WWNC: Mike Wolf, Appalachian Forest Consultants, WWNC assessment; Todd Sherbondy, Davey Tree Experts, i-Tree Analysis; Dr. Sara Kuebbing and Dr. Marion Holmes, University of Pittsburgh, Mapping WWNC Invasive Plants. Response to Draft Management Plan: 250 pages -petition, survey, assembled member letters: forester and biologists assessments; original WWNC Project 70 application, and more. Alerting DCNR: Contacted DCNR April 15, 2020 to inform them of the Township's unapproved plans for the WWNC; copy DCNR on all public feedback provided by citizens/FWW members to White Township regarding the Township's Draft Management plan; continue to rely on DCNR documents and strategic plans. Action for Good Government: Successful challenge to alleged violations of the Sunshine Act & pending challenge to alleged violation of the Second Class Township Code; bi-monthly participation in Township meetings. Alerting the Community: Monthly newsletter; website, FWW member email distribution; plant walks, bird walks; radio interviews, Indiana Gazette letters; Indigo bus posters. Networking with other Pennsylvania parks & forests organizations (too many to list!) including the PA Parks & Forests Foundation, the Sierra Club, the PA Nature Conservancy, the Western PA Conservancy, the PA Natural Heritage Program, the PA Freedom of Information Coalition, and the National Natural Areas Association. Applying for Grants: Indiana County Endowment (awarded); American Water Company (unfunded); Sierra Club Huplits Grant (application pending). **Stopped for Now:** Destruction of WWNC via the Township's Draft Management Plan per DCNR Bureau of Recreation & Conservation Ruling, released 4.14.21. FWW Award Nomination: 2021 Evergreen Conservancy Environmental Award.
